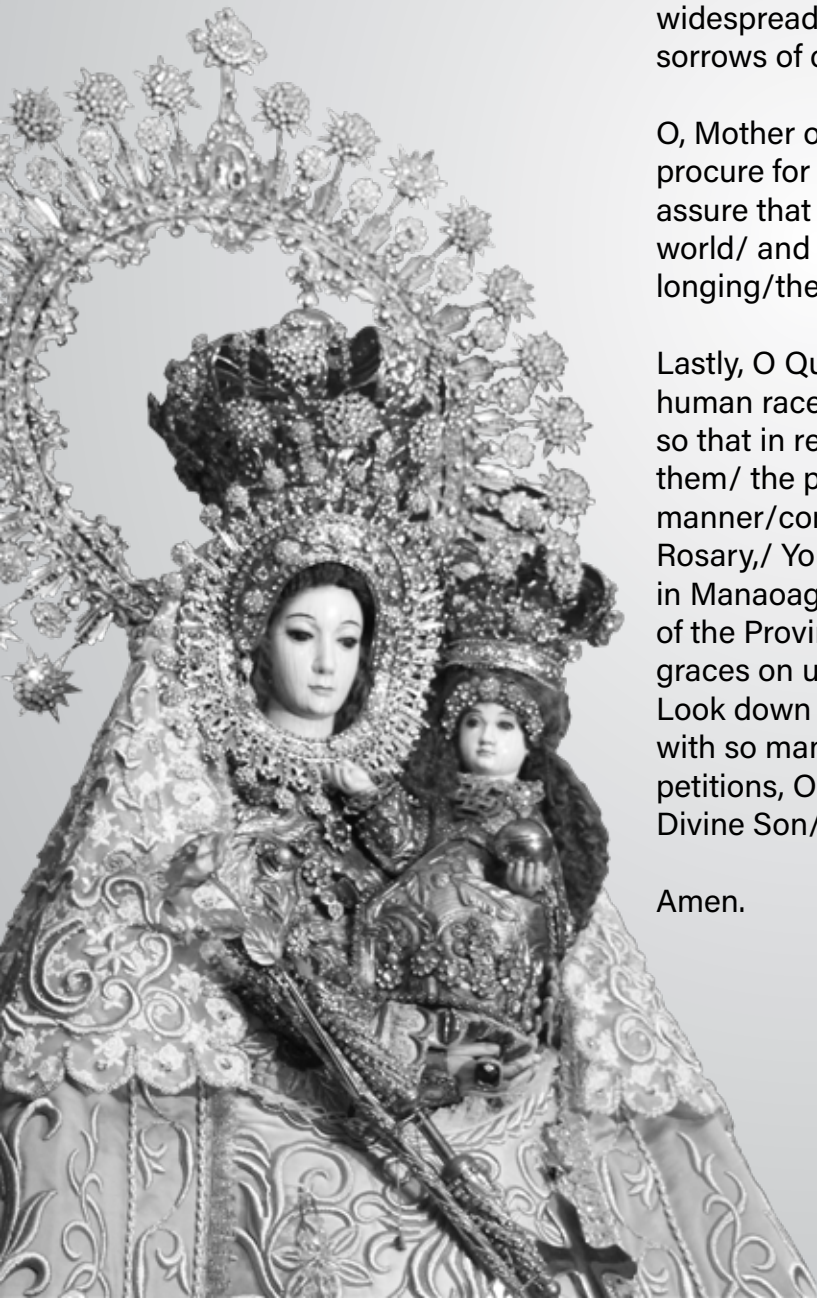
# ACT OF CONSECRATION

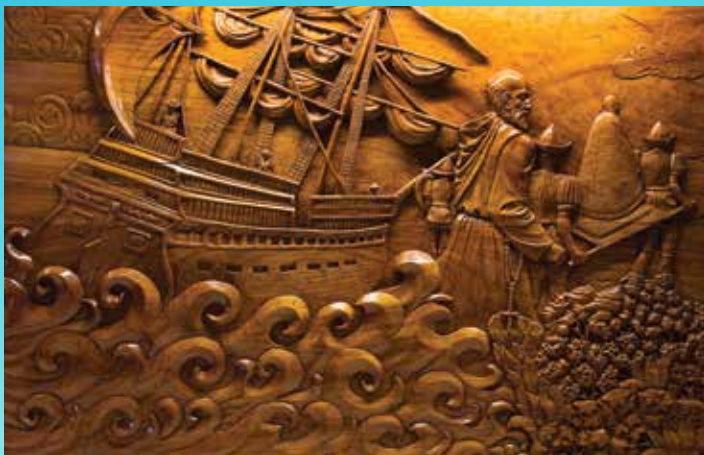
# DIMAD APO YA MANTATAOAG: A HISTORY OF OUR LADY OF MANAOAG



**M**ore than four hundred years ago, a middle-aged farmer was just passing by the foot of a little hill, where the church of the Minor Basilica is now erected, when he suddenly heard a voice of ineffable softness, calling him by name. He looked up towards the top of the mountain, from where the voice was coming, and he saw the incredible sight of a very white and shining cloud resting on the top of a very leafy tree. Fearfully, he went towards the place that attracted his attention. And as soon as he arrived, the heavenly vision of a Lady, carrying her Son in the center of the cloud, appeared. It was Our Lady of the Rosary, who wished that a Shrine be erected at that same place, where her devotees could go to implore her maternal protection. This story took place probably between 1605 to 1610, when the head of the Dominican Mission was Fr. Juan de San Jacinto, OP, the first Dominican missionary in Manaoag.







Indeed, every day, especially on the weekends, thousands, if not millions, of devotees flock to this otherwise quaint little town of Manaoag, named after the apparition. The name Manaoag was derived from the words that the devotees would use to describe the place: "*Dimad Virgen ya Mantataoag*", translated as "to the place where the Virgin calls." Devotees flock to this town to hear Mass, pray the Holy Rosary, offer flowers, light candles and venerate the miraculous image of Our Lady of the Rosary at the Minor Basilica. Pilgrimages reach their peak from the season of Lent till Easter, in May and October, and on the feast days of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, which are celebrated here on the first Sunday of October and the 3rd Wednesday after Easter Sunday.

### **The Start of the Dominican Mission in Manaoag**

Before the Dominican mission, Manaoag was under the spiritual administration of the Augustinian missionaries. The Augustinians took upon themselves the evangelization of Manaoag, where they founded a church under the advocacy and patronage of Sta. Monica, which they soon attached as a "*visita*" to the convent of Lingayen. The Augustinians accepted the Manaoag mission on October 31, 1600. In 1605, the Augustinians surrendered the administration of Manaoag and handed it over to the Dominicans who had already made their third foundation in Mangaldan, much closer to Manaoag. The Province of the Holy Rosary accepted this offer and placed Santa Monica at the hands of Fr. Juan de San Jacinto, OP, who was, at that time, the Vicar of Mangaldan. In 1608, Manaoag was formally accepted by the Provincial Chapter of the Dominicans as a "house," a status indicating some stability. In 1610, when Manaoag was deemed stable enough, the Provincial Chapter accepted it as a *vicaría*, the equivalent of a parish. Its first Dominican vicar was Fr. Tomas Gutierrez, OP, with Fr. Luis Garcia, OP as his assistant.

The initial community at Santa Monica found itself a target of attacks from the nearby hill tribes as Manaoag was surrounded by the Igorots and Negritos living in the neighboring hills. Thus, when the Dominicans accepted this mission, Fr. San Jacinto transferred the town to its present site on a hill (*Pogalo* or *Pogaro*) across the *Baloquing* to keep the tribes off. Fr. Juan de San Jacinto, OP thought of building a chapel and dedicating it to Our Lady of the Rosary. This, or a succeeding church, must have been of light material, for as Father Aduarte, a historian of Manaoag, states in his *Historia*, "the roof of the church and house was of nipa shingles." According to Prof. Regalado Trota Jose, "It is not quite clear in the written histories which came first: the decision to transfer to the new site on the hill, which was more defensible, or the call of Our Lady to the farmer." But we know that the present site where the Sanctuary of the Our Lady is standing is believed to be where the apparition happened.

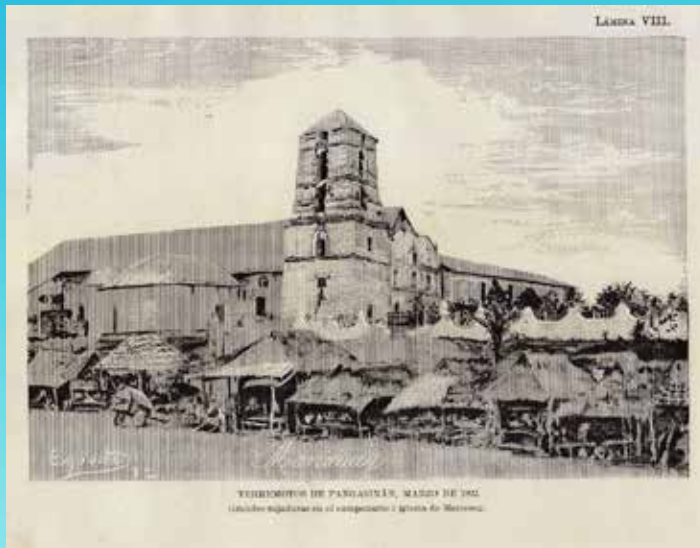
### The Origin of the Ivory Image of the Virgin

The miraculous ivory image of Our Lady of Manaoag is loved by her devotees and the people of Manaoag because of her sweet motherly eyes. Historians and researchers contest the origin of the image. Fr. Mariano Rodriguez, OP claimed that this image is from Mexico, brought by the Dominican missionaries. But there is a recent claim, based on the artistic features of the image, that the origin of the image of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag is oriental. Prof. Jose would claim that "the image of Our Lady manifests her Filipino and Oriental origins: large eyes, impassive gaze, fleshy nose, long neck, long fingers. Her hair, as that of the Child, is gold-leafed, another Oriental trait. Long, candle-like fingers are, likewise, characteristic of 17th-century Philippine ivory images. The repetitive locks of curled hair of the Santo Niño, coupled with the gold-leaf finish, are additional marks of 17th-century Philippine ivory images."

### The History of the Church Structure

By the end of the 17th century, Fr. Diego Ballesteros, OP considered transferring the church to where the Augustinians built the original Santa Monica church (where the present Catholic cemetery stands). But this did not happen. Instead, the whole structure they built there had suddenly and miraculously vanished as if saying they should not proceed with the transfer of the church.

In 1701, a Spaniard couple, Captain Gaspar de Gamboa and his wife, Doña Agata Yangta, saw how bare the church was where the Lady was enshrined. So they began the construction of a church for the town and people of Manaoag. On June 8, 1722, Gaspar de Gamboa donated the church to the Dominican Order by a deed of donation *inter vivos*, done before the Alcalde Mayor of Pangasinan, Gaspar Sanchez Bernardo de Quiros and in the presence of his wife.



The splendid result of the generosity of Gamboa and his wife was “a small but beautiful church, although a little small for Manaoag’s growing population,” with its adjacent belfry, both of brick. On April 13, 1733, Doña Agata, in her name and the name of her already deceased husband, validated this donation with her verbal consent but without her signature, which was needed since the church had been built with their common savings. Doña Agata died in January of 1753 and was buried in the church’s baptistry.

The church was continually spruced up—earthquakes in 1832 and 1833 necessitated repairs, after which the tower and façade were whitewashed. The tiled roof was replaced in 1871-1872 with galvanized iron sheets. Another earthquake in 1880 created a crack on the bell tower, which had to be torn down. Under the direction of Fr. Hilario del Campo, construction of a transept began in 1882. Foundations, 10 meters deep, were dug to support walls that were 3 meters thick. In 1883, a baptistry rose on the site of the demolished belfry.

On March 16, 1891, the Dominican Province renounced temporal ownership of all its churches and conventos in the Diocese of Nueva Segovia. The only property that was retained was Manaoag, by virtue of the cession made in the early 18th century to the Dominicans by Capitan Gamboa and his wife and also “because of its religious and sentimental value, since Manaoag had been blessed with the sanctuary of Our Blessed Lady of the Rosary and it had been, and still is, a center of pilgrimages.”

Still another earthquake struck in 1892, this time more destructive than the rest. As a result, the whole of the church that was donated by the Gamboas had to be demolished. By 1896, just when the walls of the new church were thought to be high enough to proceed laying the roof the Philippine Revolution came, deterring the construction.

## The Philippine Revolution

On May 10, 1898, when the Tagalog provinces were still at peace, after the pact of Biak-na-Bato, the insurgents of Pangasinan assaulted Manaoag. They put to the torch the provisional chapel or camarin, which burned entirely, together with three unlucky sacristans and the jewelry of Our Lady that had been accumulated for almost three hundred years. The image, however, escaped unscathed because it had been removed beforehand and thrown into a nearby ravine, perhaps by the revolutionaries who wanted to carry it off as a trophy of their expected victory. From there, it was rescued by the “volunteers” of Manaoag, who killed five revolutionaries on the spot, plus fifty-five who fell elsewhere in the town.

In June, the Spanish government in the Philippines seemed to be on the verge of a total collapse. On their way to Dagupan, the “volunteers”, Filipino pro-Spanish soldiers of Villasis, Pozorrubio and Manaoag, escorted the image of Our Lady, which was transferred there by the Dominican Fathers. They all arrived on June 27, 1898. After the surrender of Dagupan on July 22, 1898, the people of Manaoag claimed the image of their beloved Lady and, with due authorization of the Filipino military authorities, took it back to their town in October. During this time, the Dominicans left most of their assignments in Pangasinan to the local clergy. When the Dominican Fathers returned after three years, the image was found most poorly sheltered, without a niche, altar or temple.

## The Return of the Dominicans after the Revolution

Fr. Mariano Pacis, a diocesan priest, arrived as the first Diocesan parish priest of that sanctuary on January 27, 1901, after the Dominicans left Manaoag. He built a little chapel, the pavement of which was of brick, the timbers of palm trees, and the roof of bamboo and nipa for the image of Our Lady. He is also the one who is instrumental to the return of the Dominicans in Manaoag after the revolution. When the Americans stayed in the Father’s convent from December 1899, the Dominicans and Fr. Pacis shared a humble residence until American troops moved out of the old convento on January 16, 1902.



The fathers then considered rebuilding the Shrine. A brigade of workers, under their immediate direction, labored so strenuously and assiduously that the reconstruction was completed in time for the festivities of April 1906. The suppression of the transept, for reasons of economy, made the church disproportionately long like a tunnel and somewhat dark. New improvements were made to the building in 1912. The floor of the church was paved with cement tiles, the ceiling was made of wood, the interior walls and the facade were replastered, and a room was added above the sacristy, behind the main altar, which was called Our Lady's dressing room.

Many years later, as a result of new negotiations between Fr. Serapio Tamayo, OP and Fr. Pedro Rosa, OP, on behalf of the Dominicans, and the Most Rev. Pedro J. Hurth, Bishop of Nueva Segovia, the Sacred Congregation of the Council gave the Dominican Order the perpetual possession of the parish of Manaoag "*ad nutum Sanctae Sedis*" that is "at the discretion of the Holy See" on January 15, 1926.



### **Solemn Canonical Coronation**

Fr. Mariano Rodriguez, OP elevated a petition to His Holiness Pope Pius XI for the canonical coronation of the image of Our Lady of the Rosary. Bishop Hurth and Prior Provincial, Fr. Tamayo, OP joined in the request. On August 12, 1925, His Holiness Pope Pius XI granted the petition through the Sacred Congregation of Rites. The Apostolic Delegate then was H.E. Guglielmo Piani, S.D.B., who crowned Our Lady, while the Archbishop of Manila, Michael J. O'Doherty crowned the Holy Child.

### **The Developments In The Church**

Fr. Hilario del Campo's plans for a transept in the 1880's were finally realized half a century later. Construction began in 1931 and ended in 1932. Topping the project was an octagonal dome consisting of a wooden framework sheathed with galvanized iron sheets. The pair of Tampingco altar pieces meant for the ends of the transept, commissioned probably as early as 1909, were finally installed. Four murals depicting scenes in the history of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag were painted on the walls by a local artist, Francisco Zarate. Over the crossing, the center of the underside of the dome was marked by a

carved wooden floral ornament, from where may have been suspended the sanctuary lamp or perhaps a chandelier.

### **Manaoag during and after World War II**

The Japanese invasion in 1942 caused no trouble to the Dominicans in Manaoag since there was scarcely any fighting in the province. The community of Dominicans in Baguio sought refuge in Manaoag. The Allied forces landing in the Gulf of Lingayen on January 9, 1945, was quite another story. Like many churches in northern Pangasinan, Manaoag suffered great damage. On January 9, 1945, Manaoag experienced the bombing squadron of the Americans. According to Fr. Pablo Fernandez, OP, "By the number of bombs that landed on the convent and the church, the Americans must have believed that the place was a focus of Japanese resistance. The truth was that there were no Japanese soldiers in Manaoag either." The convent and the church were extensively damaged from direct hits or bombs landed nearby and from machine gun fire. Soon after, the community returned to the Shrine, which seemed like a total ruin at first. A closer examination, however, disclosed the possibility of repair. To this end the Fathers devoted their time and energy during the months that followed, with the Americans helping in part.

In 1947, the Spanish-era Convento was turned into a school, the Holy Rosary Academy (became Our Lady of Manaoag College and now Colegio de San Juan de Letran). A new convento was built on the north end of the church. Construction lasted from January 4 to August 15, 1954. Included in the project was a modern bell tower with a new bell still standing on the original site adjoining the north edge of the façade.



### **Under The Helm Of The Filipino Dominicans**

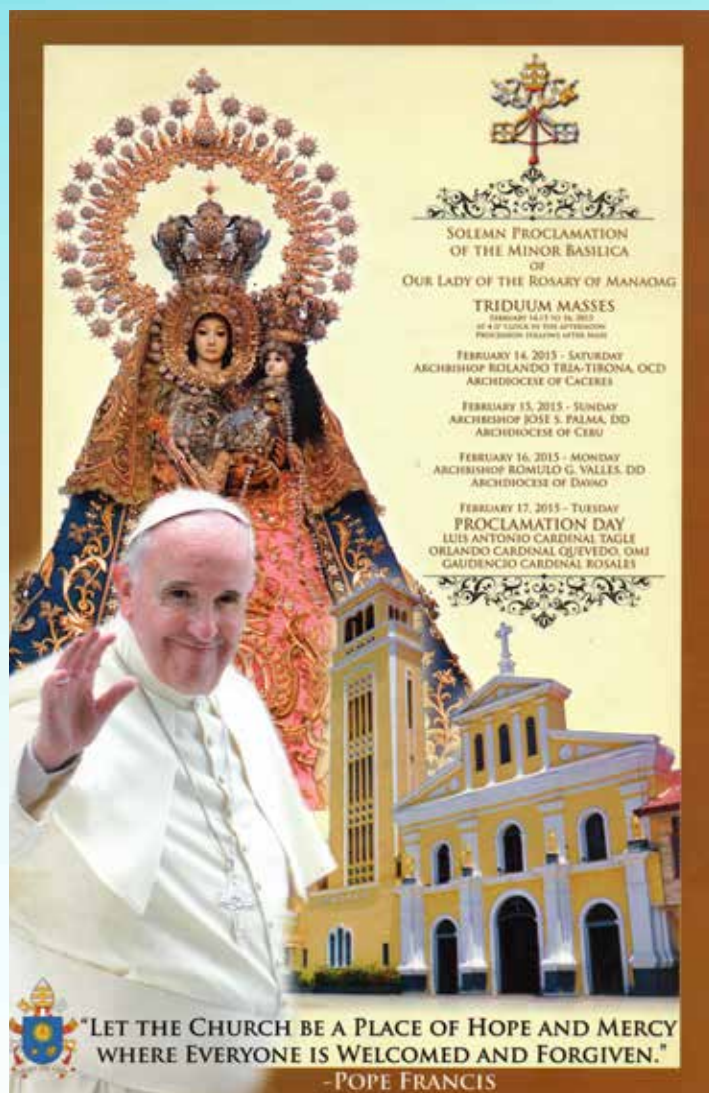
In 1971, the Dominican Province of the Philippines was established. The convent was turned over to the Filipino Dominicans in 1972, with Rev. Fr. Crispin Marqueses, OP, as the First Filipino Prior. It also marked the changes in the Catholic Church brought about by Vatican II. A new sanctuary was erected around 1976, allowing the congregation a better view of the ministers around the Altar Table. It is believed that the new sanctuary stands on the original site of the throne of Our Lady.





Manaoag also became the home of the formation of the Filipino Dominicans. The Dominican Novitiate of the Annunciation found its permanent home at the lower end of a slope behind the church on March 25, 1990.

Many special and historic events followed. A Special Bond of Spiritual Affinity with the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome was granted on April 21, 2011. The Shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag is the first in the Philippines to have this status. This bond assures pilgrims of the same blessings and the chance to obtain a plenary indulgence, just as they would when visiting a papal basilica in Rome. In February 2015, the Shrine was elevated as a Minor Basilica in a ceremony attended by more than 100 archbishops and bishops, leaders of church and state, and thousands of devotees. The latest significant event was the declaration of the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag as a National Cultural Treasure on December 23, 2015. The marker was unveiled on February 17, 2018.

**St. Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila**

The Filipino proto-martyr, Lorenzo Ruiz was born in Binondo, Manila and, at a young age, became a member of the Rosary Confraternity. Implicated in a crime of unclear circumstances, he left his wife and children and set sail for Okinawa in 1636 together with other Dominican Missionaries. Arrested, they were brought to Nagasaki, where they underwent hideous torments for their Christian faith, giving up their souls to God on September 28, 1637.



**St. Martin de Porres**

This humble saint, son of a Spanish father and a black Panamanian mother, was born in Lima, Peru in 1579. As a boy, he learned the art of healing. As a Dominican, he served as an infirmarian and healed the illness of the poor and animals. He led a life of profound prayer, penance and extraordinary spiritual gifts. He is the patron of the poor and the sick.



**St. Vincent Ferrer**

Born in Spain in 1350, St. Vincent Ferrer received the Dominican habit at the age of seventeen. In this turbulent epoch, he was an angel of peace, preaching the word of God with special stress on penance and the Last Judgment. He was outstanding for the gift of prophecy, worked astonishing miracles and brought back thousands to the practice of their faith.



**St. Catherine of Siena**

The 23rd child of working parents, she was born in Siena, Italy in 1347. Showing early signs of unusual sanctity, she joined the Third Order of the Dominicans and became a spiritual guide to many. She influenced public affairs and encouraged the Pope to leave Avignon in 1377 and return to Rome. She dictated spiritual reflections into writings. She died in 1380 and was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970.



**St. Raymond of Peñafort**

A Spaniard born in 1175, St. Raymond of Peñafort became a priest and professor of philosophy and Canon Law. A co-founder of the Order of the Redemption of Captives, he studied Arabic and the Koran to dialogue with Muslims. He died a centenarian on January 6, 1275 and was declared a saint in 1601.



**St. John Macias**

A cooperator-brother like St. Martin, St. John Macias was born in Ribwa, Spain in 1565. Embracing the Dominican way of life in 1623, he became a porter and set out at once to serve the poor who came to the priory gate for alms. He is distinguished for his great devotion to the rosary and untiring supplications for the souls in purgatory.



**St. Vincent Liem dela Paz**

The first Vietnamese Dominican martyr, he was born in Tra'Lu in 1732. He received the Dominican habit in Manila and studied at the Colegio de San Juan de Letran in Intramuros and the University of Sto. Tomas in Manila. Already a priest, he asked to return to his land to work among his people. He labored for 14 years until he was captured and martyred on November 7, 1773.



**St. Peter of Verona-Martyr**

Born in Verona in 1206 to heretical parents, he met St. Dominic in Bologna at age 15 and begged admission to the Order. He soon became a celebrated preacher and engaged in disputes with the heretics all over Northern Italy. Enraged, his enemies ambushed and killed him on the road to Milan. In his own blood, he wrote, "Credo in unum Deum". He is the first Dominican martyr.



# SAINTS OF THE ROSARY



**St. Rose of Lima**

The first saint of the Americas, she was born in Lima, Peru in 1586. An intelligent and efficient woman, she took St. Catherine of Siena as her model. At 15, she received the habit of the Third Order of Dominicans. In obedience to her parents, she did not enter the convent but lived at home a humble life of penance and mystical prayer.



**St. Margaret of Hungary**

Of royal patronage, she was offered to God by her parents before her birth in 1242 with the petition that her country would be delivered from the Tartar invasions. In fulfillment of the vow, she spent her childhood in the monastery. When her parents obtained a papal dispensation from her vows so that she could marry the king of Bohemia, she refused and said: "I esteem infinitely more the King of Heaven than the crown offered me by the king of Bohemia."



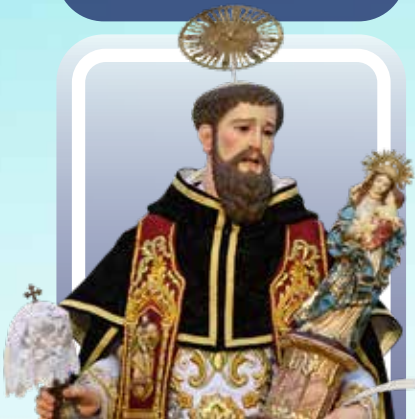
**St. Agnes of Montepulciano**

She was born in 1268 and embraced religious life at an early age. Because of her precocious wisdom and sanctity, she became superior to her community at the age of 15. Later she founded a monastery of Dominican Nuns in Montepulciano and became its first prioress. She died in 1317 at age 49 and was canonized in 1726.



**St. Magdalene of Nagasaki**

She was left on her own resources at the age of twenty-two when her parents perished in the great persecution in Japan. She placed herself under the direction of a Dominican father, Jordan of St. Stephen, and received the habit as a tertiary. At a public hearing presided over by the Mandarin, after her arrest and torture, she stood up and cried out her profession of faith. She was martyred in 1634.



**St. Hyacinth**

He was also known as the Polish St. Dominic and was born into a noble family in Odrowatz, Poland. He performed great miracles and cures. On every occasion of his life, our Lady was to lighten the load for him, and as a last favor, she appeared to tell him that he would die on the Feast of Assumption.



**St. Thomas Aquinas**

The great Dominican teacher lived only for 49 years (1225-1274). But he traveled much, from his birthplace at Aquino in Central Italy to Cologne, to Paris, to Rome and to the monastery near Naples where he died. Thomas prayed much and dedicated his brilliant talents to investigating the same truth of God in the light of faith and the human intellect. Canonized in 1923, he is the patron of all Catholic schools and is titled "the Angelic Doctor".



**St. Dominic de Guzman**

Born in 1170 in Old Castile Spain, he became a priest with thoughts of missionary work in North Europe. But then he saw the dangers in the Albigensian for heresy. He lived and preached in evangelical poverty, gathered others around him and founded the Order of Preachers (also known as Dominicans). Dominic labored in France, Spain, and Italy. Consumed by work and penance, he died on August 06, 1221.



**St. Joseph**

The husband of Mary was a faithful, patient man, obedient to the demands of God and willingly accepting hardships. In 1870, Pope Pius IX proclaimed Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church, honoring his role of support, protection and guidance, and named March 19 as "the (heavenly) birthday of St. Joseph". Pius XII added a second feast of St. Joseph the Worker, which is celebrated on May 1st, the traditional Labor Day.



# RETABLO: INSPIRING ACROSS THE CENTURY

In 2021, the Priory of the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag (OLRM) embarked on a noble mission to push through with conserving the Retablo of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag.

The Basilica certainly owes its phenomenal growth in devotion to the Blessed Mother herself as the Lady who calls - *Ina'n Birhen ya Man-tataoag*. However, aside from her miraculous image reposed in this sanctuary, the Minor Basilica is also home to various treasures of the sacred arts. This collection includes bells, liturgical vessels, paintings, images of saints, and the most visible from the church pews, the Virgin's Retablo. This retablo, which serves as the throne of the image of OLRM, is a piece of religious artifact dating back to the Spanish era, as early as 1909. Isabelo Tampingco, perhaps the most famous sculptor of his generation, is credited for this magnificent work. Quite unique to this throne is the integration of "anahaw" leaves in the design.

The need to preserve this retablo had already surfaced years before. The visible deterioration of this artifact may be due to exposure to various elements (from smoke to heat) and the introduction of plyboards. To undertake this delicate project of conserving, restoring, and repairing the retablo, the Priory commissioned Escuela Taller de Filipinas Foundation for this task. It is important to note that Escuela Taller is certified by the National Government to undertake restoration and conservation projects in the country. After a thorough study, the output of which is worthy of academic publication, the Priory proceeded with the conservation process.

Beginning on August 4, 2021, Escuela Taller's skilled craftsmen started work on each piece of the retablo. The tedious process included careful removal of paint layers and replacement of termite-corroded parts from old wood of the same species. Since Isabelo Tampingco used wood endemic to the Philippines such as yakal and narra, the conservation also required the use of old wood in replacing compromised parts. One of the discoveries during the removal of paint layers is the variety of colors applied to the retablo. By comparing old photographs and documents to their present state, the experts opined that the earliest alteration of the retablo was in the 1950s, followed by some modifications around 1978. A photograph taken in

1997 features highly gilded surfaces and dark tones. Several more alterations were said to have taken place from the year 2000 onwards.

According to the report made by Escuela Taller, "as many as seven layers of paint and finishing was recorded in certain areas of the retablo." However, the absence of documents on various interventions and alterations to the retablo resulted in many unanswered questions relative to this piece of art. For instance, when was the concrete frame of the retablo constructed? What was the earliest color of the retablo and when were the different iterations introduced? More importantly, questions can be raised on what inspired administrators (Parish Priests or Priors of the community) during their term of office to apply a particular color to the retablo?

Nonetheless, for this period, the Dominican community of the Priory laid down the principles in color selection of the present retablo, i.e., the retablo will be true to its function as a background and its color and decorations should not compete with simple and noble grandeur of the image of OLRM. The conservation that took more than six months to complete was well documented and one of the projects of the Priory is to publish this material that can serve as a guide to restoring wooden retablos of other churches.

Finally, on May 2022, the conservation project was completed. Celebrating yet another milestone in the life of the Basilica, the re-enthronement of the virgin to the conserved retablo was held on April 23, 2022, in the same retablo built for her more than a hundred years ago by her generous devotees. Her maternal care for her devotees made palpable in her image is one reason that we continue to venerate the image of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag. By restoring and conserving this retablo, we help ensure that future generations of devotees can seek the intercession of the Blessed Mother of Manaoag reposed in this restored and conserved shrine. Indeed, every splinter of wood conserved in the retablo are sweat and tears of the devotees, like those poured in every bead of the rosary recited at the foot of her altar. Lastly, by conserving her retablo, we remember and take to heart, Christ's words entrusting his Mother to the beloved disciple.

# CONSERVING AND REPURPOSING THE FRIARS' CONVENT

**T**he old convent is one of the landmarks in the compound of the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Manaoag. It is a two-story structure that abuts perpendicularly to the Church building on its southern wall. The ground floor is constructed from bricks and stones, while the second floor is made of wood. One of the oldest pictures of the church showed the prominence of this wooden architecture that served as home to Dominican Friars assigned at the Priory of Our Lady of the Rosary.

When the Friars transferred to the present convent, the building served as classrooms of the Holy Rosary Academy (1947) that Fr. Teodolo Cajigal, OP founded. When the academic institution offered tertiary education programs, the name was changed to Our Lady of Manaoag College (2001). In 2014, the school was integrated into the Letran tradition of schools under the Dominican Province of the Philippines. Hence, it is now named Colegio de San Juan de Letran – Manaoag.

After serving for decades as home to friars, and for sometime as the barracks of the US Army during World War II, and recently as a learning space for the youth of *Manaoag*, the same old building now requires a thorough repair. However, just like the retablo, this architectural artifact also required a comprehensive study upon which the conservation and repairs will be based. Also, the conservation will now reflect the community's aspiration

for this building. After a discussion in the Conventual Chapter and Conventual Council, the members of the Priory decided to repurpose the space into a living and learning museum and as the place for the Conventual Archives. To undertake the study and provide inputs on the design of the museum and archives, the Priory again engaged the expert assistance of Escuela Taller de Filipinas. The community looks forward to this space where devotees can appreciate artifacts and other tangible heritage related to the image and devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag.







# CARROZA RESTORATION

One of the hidden appurtenances of the ecclesiastical arts are the carrozas used during processions. At the Minor Basilica of OLRM, creatively adorned with blooms and other religious arts, these carrozas carry the images of the saints during the Canonical Feast (Summer) and Rosary Feast (October).

There are three kinds of carrozas maintained by the Minor Basilica. The grand carroza which carries the miraculous image or what is referred to as the *"numero uno"* during the two major processions. Then, there are four carrozas the exteriors of which are adorned with beaten silver or what is referred to as *"pukpok"* metal works made by artisan plateros of olden times. These hand-made decorations in bas-relief style give each carriage a unique character. Interestingly, one particular carroza with a decorative arched cornice bordering the Marian insignia of Auspice Mariae in the center may be traced back to photographs taken from the Canonical coronation of Apo Baket in 1926. Some are of the opinion that these four carrozas were crafted more than a century ago. Third, let's call them ordinary carrozas as they were made simply of wood. These carriages of the last category carry the Dominican Saints in the procession.

It is worth noting that one carroza reserves a space for an andas. The design also seems to suggest that in the earlier times this particular carroza might have been used as the carriage of the *"numero uno"*.

Most recently, the carrozas of the third category were repaired. The less durable plyboards were replaced with repurposed yakal planks sourced from a *"mambubulok"* (buyer of old houses) in Sual, Pangasinan. In the olden times, yakal wood was favored for important architectural purposes and noted for its resistance to immense



transverse pressure. Not only will these hardwood planks give longevity to these carriages, they also bring with them the stories they had from their previous state of being. It is as if these old wood were spiritually rejuvenated, just like every devotee whose spiritual well-being is refreshed through their devotion to Blessed Mother.



# ABONG NI INA'N MARIA



If you go to Manaoag, one of the many devotional practices you can observe at the Minor Basilica of OLRM is the presence of students preparing for their licensure examinations. It has already been a tradition for examinees to offer a visit to Manaoag before taking their licensure examinations. After studying assiduously for their most important examination in their career, many Catholic students go to the Minor Basilica of OLRM to seek God's help and the Blessed Mother's intercession to pass this hurdle. After giving their best during their review, they recognize the importance of asking for God's grace to illuminate their reason and bless them with a retentive memory. After hearing mass and lighting candles, they approach a priest to ask him to pray over them and bless them. Carrying their reviewers, pens and pencils, calculators, and even their uniforms, they go to Manaoag to ask for God's help. The Dominican Fathers gently remind them that it is not their paraphernalia and pens that are blessed, but they, the examinees, who need blessings and prayers. After the blessing, they often promise that when they become professionals, they will return and express their gratitude for the help they received through the intercession of the Blessed Mother of Manaoag. This religious practice of seeking a blessing to pass the licensure exam

and the examinees' promises are the two main reasons for the construction of *Abong ni Ina'n Maria* Outreach Center, a space where these devotees can fulfill their promise of helping the most needy in our society through the practice of their profession.

This two-floor building will house the outreach clinic, provide a space for legal consultation and the *Nutriskwela* feeding program. This project, which is funded by devotees of OLRM, aims to have a special place for people who are in need. While waiting for the completion of the said building, the community is already crafting a health-related program. Also, linkages are already being established to sustain the activities and programs of this outreach center. Building the *Abong ni Ina'n Maria* is a fulfillment of the community's aspiration to extend the generosity of the Blessed Virgin of Manaoag especially to those in most need.

When this building is finished, our doctors, nurses, lawyers, teachers and other professionals can celebrate their thanksgiving by offering their time (even for just an hour or two) to attend to the various needs not only of the devotees of OLRM but to anyone who needs help.





# OF PRAYERS AND BLOOMS: OLRM ROSARY GARDEN

Located in the mid-lower portion of the shrine compound, and adjacent to the candle gallery and Dominican Novitiate of the Annunciation (DNA) compound is the Rosary Garden of the Minor Basilica. Its landscape invites devotees to pray the Holy Rosary amidst the flora and the koi pond which gives life to the garden. It is also a favorite spot for young pilgrims to satisfy their penchant for instagrammable photos.

Like many projects at the Minor Basilica, the Rosary Garden is an expression of devotees' fervor. This garden was initiated by the late Fr. Gaudencio "Goody" Mondragon, OP, who also supervised its construction. When Pope John Paul II, introduced the Mysteries of the Light of the Holy Rosary, life-sized statues depicting those mysteries were added to the ensemble of original images of this Marian prayer. The Rosary Garden invites the pilgrims to immerse themselves and participate in the life of Jesus Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary.



At the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Rosary Garden was temporarily closed. During this lull, the garden was revitalized with replanting projects and the images were repainted. Added to the collection of flowering plants were Mussaenda, Amherstia, Roman Candle and Honeysuckle, just to name a few. When the lockdown ended, the devotees began to return to pray and visit the Rosary Garden, and many of them took post-worthy photos.





# OUR LADY OF MANAOAG SPIRITUALITY CENTER



**T**he Priory maintains Our Lady of Manaoag Spirituality Center at Brgy. Sapang, Manaoag. This center provides a facility where different activities of the Dominican Laity, both local and regional chapters, can be held. Throughout the years after its establishment, the Dominican Laity has organized and held seminars, retreats, recollections, training, and other vital and significant gatherings of the OP Laity to strengthen and further nourish their spiritual growth.

The center's construction was initiated by the late Fr. Domingo Nacion, OP, in mid-2000. It occupies a land area of 2,600 square meters with abundant trees within the compound. The center has a spacious circular chapel that functions as a conference hall. Other edifices in the complex include a small building with a Library, toilet, discussion area, kitchen, and a bodega. The community also built a small house that served as a quarantine facility for employees infected by the COVID-19 virus.

Last year, the chapel and adjacent building were repaired and renovated. A big fan was installed, and the ventilation system was integrated. Three gazebos were added to accommodate small group activities. In one of the corners of the complex, a small enclosed area serves as a compost pit for leaves and other green waste.

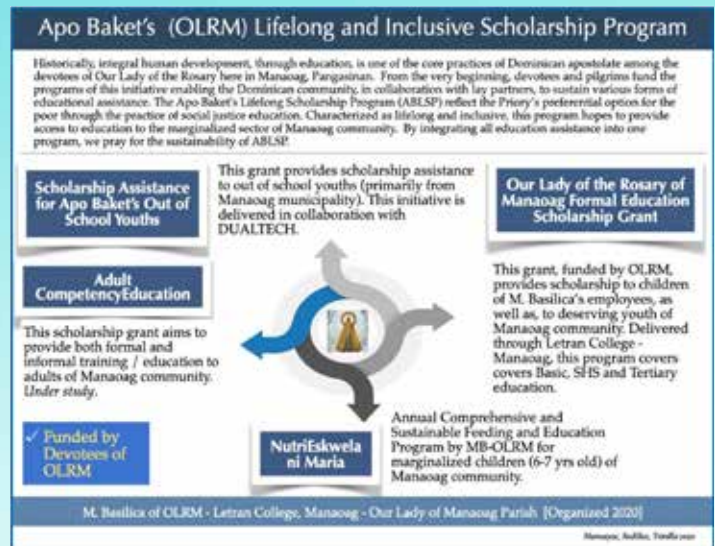
While primarily intended for the Dominican laity, the renovated center is open to other spiritual activities like retreats and recollections, team building, and other spiritual activities.



# APO BAKET'S (OLRM) LIFELONG AND INCLUSIVE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

One of the contributions of the Dominicans to the Church and Philippine society is the education of the youth. With no exception, the Dominican friars in Manaog sustain this goal and contribute to the education of the people of Manaog, Pangasinan and nearby communities. All education-related assistance by the Minor Basilica is contained in the program *Apo Baket's* Lifelong and Inclusive Scholarship Program. This practice of helping the youth obtain their formal education is not new. For instance, during the Spanish period, the Friars would matriculate for young famulos (young male helper in the convent) in exchange for their work or services in the convent.

Currently, there are three ongoing programs. First, the Nutriskwela ni Maria Feeding Program is 6-month feeding and schooling program for children (between 6-7 years of age). Every day, from Monday to Friday, for two hours (10-12), volunteers and staff of the Minor Basilica prepare lunch meals for 50 children. These children are taught the basics, i.e., reading, writing, arithmetic and catechism before service with ordinary but nutritious meals. Parents who accompany them would also receive various training and seminars (e.g., health and hygiene). Second, in collaboration with DUALTECH, the Minor Basilica also sends out-of-school youths or graduates of K-12 programs for vocational training programs. Aside from scholars from Manaog, this program is also extended to youths of Camiguin and Calayan Islands (mission territories of the Dominican Province of the Philippines). Third, formal education scholars are provided to employees' children and to deserving /qualified scholars. This third category also includes the "Iskolar ni Maria" scholarship program which began in 1996. This education program provides opportunities to indigent but well-deserving students to obtain a degree. The "Iskolar ni Maria" project of the Minor Basilica supports the enrollment of these scholars and provides other support that will increase their likelihood of success. In return, the Minor Basilica asks for the help of these scholars in managing the stores and assisting in the different offices in the Basilica.



Where do we get the resources to fund this scholarship program? Like many projects, *Ina'n Birhen ng Manaog* provides through the generosity of her devotees. To augment the scholarship fund, the Minor Basilica recycles the scrap candles and makes them available to pilgrims (donation only). The proceeds of these repurposed candles send the youth to school. Maraming Salamat Po!





# CULTURAL MAPPING: AN INITIAL INVENTORY OF OLRM TANGIBLE HERITAGE

To preserve the tangible and intangible heritage related to the image and devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag, the Minor Basilica community initiated a cultural mapping project. With the assistance of Prof. Ricamela Palis and Prof. Lorenzo Isla, members of the National Commission for Culture and the Arts, volunteers composed mainly of Catechists of the OLRM Parish were trained to conduct the cultural mapping of tangible heritage items. The Priory decided to empower the members of the local community for this endeavor rather than engaging the assistance of external mappers. By empowering the local community, the sustainability of the process is secured. We argued that it will be best to empower the locals (catechists, teachers and employees) since they are the ones who will stay longer in this community and benefit from this cultural mapping. For this reason the cultural mapping took time, particularly because the mappers also have their “day jobs”. To ensure that the mapping process is productive, the Priory tasked Ms. Mernie De Vera Rivera, our Museum Head, to assist the volunteer mappers and guide the project toward completion. The initial harvest of 122 artifacts that included paintings, liturgical vestments, images and trees, just to name a few, were presented to the larger community (i.e., LGU representatives, faculty of Letran Manaoag and parishioners) during the Community Validation activity on August 12, 2022. The day-long community validation was facilitated by Professors Palis, Isla and Duhaylungsod. Also actively engaged during the validation process were



Fr. Gaspar Sigaya, OP (UST Archives), Fr. Pablo Tiong, OP (VP Religious Affairs, UST and a native of Manaoag), Bro. Wilhelm Boñon, OP (Dominican Student Brother and a native of Manaoag), employees of the Minor Basilica and the community of Manaoag.

Towards the end of the community validation, even as the Minor Basilica assured the Manaoag community that it will proceed with the mapping of intangible heritage matters, it also invited the other sectors of Manaoag to embark on the same project, i.e., mapping heritage materials outside of the complex of the Minor Basilica.

This cultural mapping program is linked to the conservation and conversion of the Old Convent to a museum. This cultural mapping aims for these tangible heritage artifacts to find a home in the future new Museum of Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag.







# OUR LADY OF MANAOAG ARTIST GUILD

The Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag welcomes a multitude of pilgrims and devotees from all around the Philippines and from different parts of the world. After COVID-19 struck the Philippines, Churches struggled to minister to the faithful. Eventually, some of them closed temporarily. The Minor Basilica then decided to engage in online masses, which, to this day, serve the devotees. As the audience of online masses increased in number, Rev. Fr. Stephen Redillas, OP, the Prior of the Convent, decided to introduce another avenue of social ministry other than the online masses.

On June 30, 2022, "Our Lady of Manaoag Artists' Guild" was launched. Its head and founder is Rev. Fr. Francis Borre, OP. The Guild gathers volunteers especially among the youth who have the energy, passion and interest in various forms and activities related to social communications. The program also aims to expose the youth to the ministry of social communication in the church, while simultaneously guiding them in their social and spiritual formation. Hence, young people are encouraged to answer the call of the Church to serve ways appropriate to their time and age - to spread the Word of God through various platforms of social media and current technologies.

The Artists' Guild produces four different programs per month. The first week focuses on street media through the program "TalkVibes" in which random netizens around the town are interviewed. For the second week of the month, the artists create music videos and teach catechetical tidbits. For the 3rd week, a program for the priests called, "Good Day! Manaoag," is produced. Finally, the 4th week is more dedicated to the production of short films, documentaries and social media magazines.

Through Our Lady of Manaoag Artists Guild, the Dominican Community of Manaoag hopes not only to discover and develop the talents of artists, especially in the realm of social communications but also to answer the call of the times by using social media to preach Christ to the present world.

# VIRTUAL FIESTA CELEBRATION



The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag is celebrated twice a year - the Canonical Coronation Anniversary Feast (celebrated every third Wednesday after Easter Sunday) and the Rosary Feast (every first Sunday of October). Before the pandemic, these well attended celebrations drew thousands of devotees during *Novenario* (nine days of prayer). Every day, within the *novenario*, the Holy Rosary and special novena prayers are recited, and Holy Mass is celebrated. On the feast day, after the last Eucharistic celebration, the original ivory image is enthroned in Her Carozza for the grand procession or "*libot*." Due to the pandemic, this much awaited and well attended celebration was prohibited by the national government. However, the prohibition did not stop the Minor Basilica community from celebrating "*sine populo*" the novenas and the fiesta. The Dominican community embraced the situation with innovation during the two years when large gatherings were prohibited. The devotees were still able to participate and celebrate the four fiestas at least virtually.

To improve the quality of broadcast, the Minor Basilica upgraded its digital equipment. While it was unsettling to celebrate without people inside the church, there were benefits also when these celebrations were live-streamed.

We received expressions of gratitude from a devotee in Mindanao because for the first time, she was able to complete her novena while simultaneously praying alongside those few people allowed to be present at the Minor Basilica.

Even the souvenir program underwent innovations. Since, even the printing press stopped operation, we were forced to organize an electronic version of the souvenir program. This can be downloaded from the official website of the Minor Basilica. In this version of the souvenir program, the Priory decided to include articles that will inform the devotees of activities during the pandemic and programs and projects after this health crisis.

While the local church is slowly transitioning towards the usual physical gathering where the sense of communion is more expressed, we cannot simply set aside the benefits of online services particularly to the sick, elderly, and disabled. To the devotees of Inang Birhen ng Manaoag residing in abroad, online services kept them connected, albeit virtually. They say that while they are abroad beholding the Blessed Virgin of Manaoag even just virtually and participating in a "local" Eucharistic Celebration somehow alleviates their longing for home.





# BASILICA IN THE CURRENTS OF MODERN LIFE



**S**ocial media has become a popular and effective means of communication, especially in preaching the Word of God. Aware of the advantages of technology in the future of the ministry, the community of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary of Manaoag, has upgraded the equipment of the Minor Basilica for a higher quality of live streaming in the Church. Some of the equipment purchased are high-powered cameras, desktop computers and sound systems.

The old CCTV cameras are still used for monitoring purposes and serve as backup cameras for live streaming. The community has also installed additional monitors inside the church, and added more monoblock chairs and lighting, allowing more open spaces to accommodate the growing congregation and yet maintain health protocols in the basilica. In the Minor Basilica, science and technology are at the service of evangelization.





# MINOR BASILICA'S SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNT AND WEBSITE



It has been almost three years since the pandemic started, drastically transforming the way we live today. Covid 19 has brought many challenges that greatly affect our society including the church. However, it has also opened new modalities of entertainment, education and communication that adapt to the new normal. Different institutions and people began to use new technological modalities, particularly social media platforms and internet websites. Certainly, the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag responded to the challenges brought about by the Pandemic.

Even before the onslaught of the pandemic, the people of Manaoag and nearby towns were fortunate to listen to the Holy Mass, Gospel Reflections and Catechesis which were aired over Radio Manaoag 102.7 FM. Surprisingly, this proved to be more useful and accessible to the homebound faithful throughout the peak of the disease. The church also made use of Facebook and YouTube to live stream Masses and the Liturgy of the Hours. In these platforms, the average views were 200,000 per week. Prayer and Liturgy, more than ever, reached the faithful, both local and overseas, in the safety and comfort of their homes, nourishing their spiritual life and strengthening their devotion to *Apo Baket*.

The official website of the Minor Basilica has also proven to be a very useful tool to communicate and disseminate information to devotees. It provides information about the updated schedule of Masses and other important activities

of the Minor Basilica. The website features online services such as the *Online Pamisa*, *Online Patulos* (candle lighting), *Padasal*, and E-mass cards; these services allow people to continue feeding their spiritual needs.

Today, the faithful are allowed to come to church and enjoy the regular life of the parish. From the start of the pandemic up to the present, it is undeniable that the Minor Basilica's social media accounts and website have made a huge contribution and impact on the spiritual life of the local residents and pilgrims, all devotees of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag.

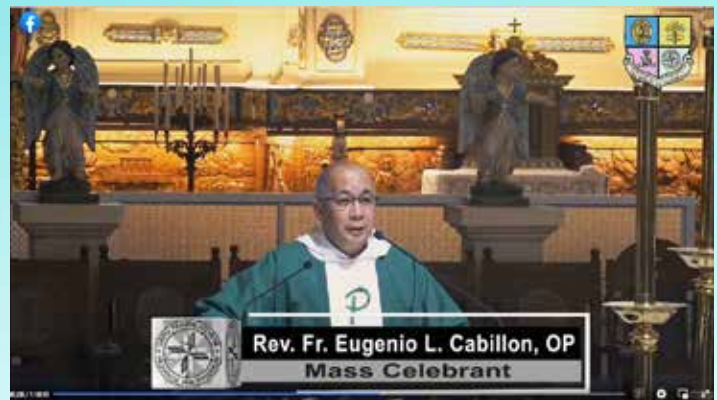
# ONLINE MASSES

**B**efore the pandemic, we used to attend and actively participate in Eucharistic celebrations with our family and friends. During the alarming widespread effects of the COVID-19 Virus, however, going out was controlled to prevent the spread of the virus. Unsure of how to navigate the pandemic, even the doors of the Minor Basilica were temporarily closed to the public.

Such challenges, however, did not stop us from continuing to practice our faith and stay connected to the church and our God. With the help of digital technology, we were able to stream our Holy Masses virtually so that we can reach the faithful inside the safety of their homes with their families. Participating in the Holy Mass and listening to the word of God and the priests' reflections not only helped the people gain more strength in facing various difficulties but also uplifted and solidified their faith and trust in God amidst the unfamiliar challenges of life.

After almost three years of being homebound, the introduction of vaccines and inoculation helped reduce the infection rate. As the vaccines became increasingly available and fear of their effect eventually diminished, devotees and pilgrims have returned.

While hopeful that the worst is over, the Minor Basilica continues to ensure the safety of Apo Baket's devotees by complying with prevailing health protocols. The livestream and online services that help sustain devotees during the pandemic will continue, albeit, for specific purposes. Indeed, nothing can replace the sense of community felt during face-to-face liturgical celebrations. It will always be a personal ritual to whisper our pleas while lighting a candle. It is consoling to see the smoke rise from our lighted candles that symbolizes our prayers we lift up to God.



The Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) encouraged the faithful to celebrate the Eucharist in a communal and physical way, reminding us of a God who did not save us virtually but was one with us (Emmanuel). Nevertheless, online services and live-streaming of masses will continue to allow the elderly, the sick and those who work and live overseas to remain connected to God and to His beloved Mother, Our Lady of Manaog.





# LENT AND EASTER AT THE HEIGHT OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC

**C**COVID-19 caught the whole world by surprise. Many lives were altered, if not ended. Life events were disrupted, most were stopped, to prevent the spread of the virus. The Church complied with the health and safety protocols laid by different government agencies. The leadership of LGU of Manaoag and the Minor Basilica collaborated on how to mitigate the spread of the virus in the locality. The discussions included how the Church can observe religious practices while respecting health protocols. We are happy that collaboration between our two institutions worked and allowed the Church to serve her children at the height of the pandemic. Hence, we were able to celebrate not only the fiestas but also liturgical celebrations during Lent, Easter, Advent and the Christmas Season.

The Parish Coordinator of Catechists, Ms. Analyne Lustre, remarked that there is a big difference between the Lenten observances before and after the pandemic. Many Lenten customs before could not be celebrated due to prevailing protocols. For instance, the blessing of palms on Palm Sunday was done in every barangay by a roving priest. During the celebration of the Last Supper, there was no kissing of the feet of the Apostles nor sending off. No one was allowed to touch and venerate the *Santo Entierro*. Veneration of the crucified Christ was done by a reverential bowing instead of kissing and touching the hand or feet of the image of the crucified Christ. At some point confessions were heard, but a plastic barrier separated the confessor

from the penitent. The pandemic might have altered our liturgical practices, but it also invited us to explore other ways of meaningfully celebrating the liturgy.

Some rites were celebrated normally, such as the visit to the Altar of Repose and the Easter Vigil Mass. The "*Salubong*" and Easter Egg Hunting were canceled though. "The Lenten observances during this time of pandemic were more solemn and in the full mood of prayerfulness and reflectiveness," says Ms. Ana. Easter Season was also very special and memorable because the image of the Risen Christ were brought to different barangays for people to venerate. The faithful were instructed to bring out their images of the Blessed Virgin Mary and cover them with a black veil or cloth, which was removed once the image of the risen Jesus Christ passed by their homes.

Indeed, this pandemic took us away from the traditional and from the usual. While this health crisis caused many to suffer, it jolted us out of complacency and it forced us to explore various Church ways of celebrating the liturgy and how to become a Church in this context.







# TULOS DURING UNDas AND A DAILY PRAYER

One cultural and religious observance that tugs at the heartstrings of the Filipinos is the *"Araw ng mga Kaluluwa or Undas"*. How we used to celebrate it was also disrupted by the pandemic. *Undas* is the day when relatives visit the graves and tombs of their departed loved ones. During the pandemic, celebrating undas was not allowed as the cemeteries were locked down too. For this reason, it was painful for many not to be able to light a candle, offer a prayer, and gather with living relatives at the cemetery during the *"undas"*.

To alleviate this sadness, the Minor Basilica thought of lighting a candle at every tomb and offering a prayer for every soul interred at the Catholic Cemetery of Manaoag. The rite, which started late in the afternoon, commenced with a celebration of the Mass for the Dead, live-streamed via Facebook and YouTube. After the Holy Mass, Catechists and Novices (Seminarians) went around to light a candle in each of the tombs in the cemetery. The latter (novices) also went around sprinkling Holy Water. The lighted candles looked like stars resting on the tomb which lifted the typical eerie impression of death. It reminded us of the beautiful communion between the living and the dead.

On regular days, the Minor Basilica also offers the *"pa-Tulos: Lighting of Candles and Prayer Offering."* Through this service, devotees who are unable to come on pilgrimage can ask Minor Basilica personnel to light a candle for them. This service is available via the official website of the Minor Basilica.



# ORGANIZING THE APO BAKET'S CANONICAL CORONATION CENTENARY CELEBRATION

The Priory of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag, together with various committees, planned the 5-year preparations for the upcoming celebration of the centenary of the canonical coronation of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag. Last April 2021, the community brainstormed possible activities for the grand celebration. Activities and projects were conceptualized and divided into 4 categories, with their respective target goals and processes.

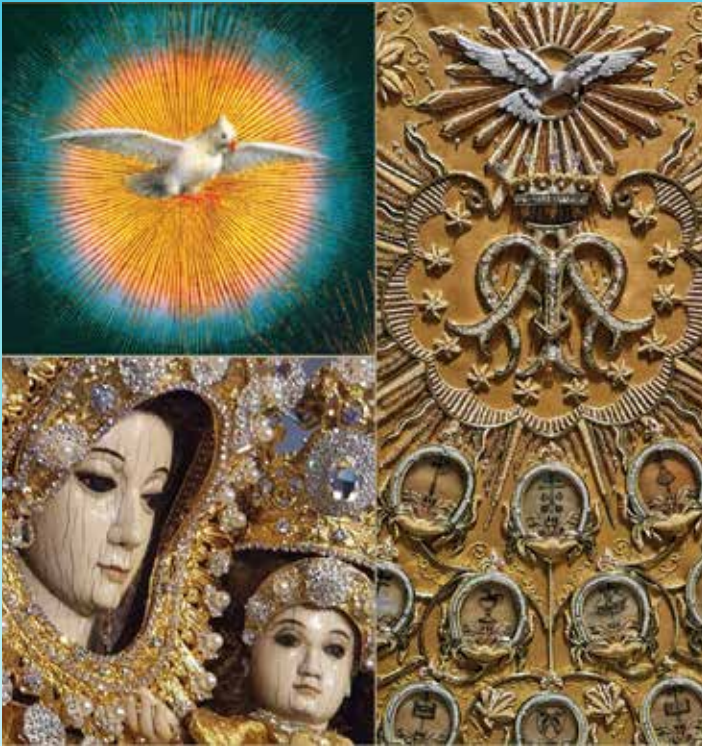

# MB OLRM RELIGIOUS PRACTICES AND COVID-19 PANDEMIC




1. Online Liturgical and Religious Services [live streaming of masses, E-Mass Card]. When the physical gathering was prohibited, we delivered online religious services through live streaming and electronic activities.
2. By Donations Only. For the “*pamisa*”, “*patulos*”, and “*padasal*”, the community approved the proposal that devotees’ contribution will only be via donation.
3. Encounter in *Situs*: Visitation of the image of *Ina’n Birhen ng Manaoag* to her devotees. Travel restrictions due to the pandemic disallowed pilgrimages. Hence, when devotees could not fulfill their pilgrimage promises, the community encouraged the visitation of the pilgrim image to parishes and hospitals. Attached herein is the table of visited localities.
4. Documenting Donations (Images and vestments). We started documenting stories about why devotees donate for the vestments and other religious paraphernalia. This practice includes naming the vestments and the design is presented to the community for Approval.

The pandemic threw us into what is referred to by the anthropologist Victor Turner as liminal spaces (i.e., a state of being in transition). The community navigated this liminal space with creativity and concern for the devotees of OLRM. We organized plans and activities that allowed us to sustain the spiritual services of the Minor Basilica even at the height of the “lockdowns” and other Covid-related prohibitions. An article in an edited book (for publication) contains an ethnography of these practices.

# "APO BAKET VISITS HER CHILDREN"

**D**evotees and pilgrims from all over the Philippines come and flock around the grounds of Manaoag to pray, visit and offer intentions to Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag. As the name "Manaoag" indicates, it is part of Inang Birhen's call for her children to this place. Hence, as a response, her devotees would embark on a pilgrimage from far and near. It is not rare to hear pilgrims articulate where they came from - from Cebu and Davao, from overseas and from nearby provinces. However, it is not only her children who journey to this place and encounter the Lady who Calls. The Lady also visits her children in their own homes particularly when the children were unable to travel. Even before the pandemic, Inang Birhen ng Manaoag would visit her devotees in their own homes (parishes). We call this the Visitation of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag. Never has there been a time when the replicas of the image were everywhere than during this Covid-19 Pandemic.

We believe that she wants to visit her children particularly when they are unable to embark on a pilgrimage. Whether here in Manaoag or in any place she meets her children, the Blessed Mother continues to intercede for her devotees assuring them God's sufficient grace to hurdle through the challenges and difficulties brought about by this pandemic.

This belief that she wants to visit her children wherever they are is not unfounded. Before the pandemic, she only had one vehicle (with a canopy) that transported her. However, a devotee provided a second vehicle increasing the times her image is brought to her children. That we received a donation (a pick up) even during an economically challenging period for many businesses clearly indicates her desire is to be where her children are. This is now one of the many beautiful practices at the Minor Basilica of OLRM.





# BIHIS: THE PRACTICE OF CHANGING THE VESTMENT OF INA'N BIRHEN

The vestments and regalia of the original and miraculous image of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaog are changed twice a year, during her feast in October and the Summer feast in April or May. These are made possible through the unwavering generosity of the families devoted to the Apo Baket.

Whenever a donor would like to sponsor vestments for Our Lady of the Rosary, the Prior and/or Community of the Dominican Fathers meet them in person, as much as possible, to discuss the process of preparing the design, manner of payment and other related matters. It has never been a custom of the Minor Basilica to look for donors of the vestments of *Apo Baket*. They voluntarily come offering to donate vestments. And those who sincerely desire to offer a set of vestments patiently wait for their turn, which currently takes a few years.

The following policies are to be observed by the benefactors of Our Lady:

- First, the benefactors talk to the authorized person in the Museum or the Prior's Office to check the availability of sponsorship.
- Second, the design of the vestment will have to be submitted at least six months before the date of sponsorship subject to the approval of the Community Chapter.
- Third, the benefactors may choose their designer subject to the approval of the Chapter.

The benefactors will be invited to join the rite of blessing the vestments and regalia in the sacristy and venerate the Blessed Mother. To keep the "*Bihis*" rite solemn, only a few people, led by the *Camareras* are allowed inside the Sacristy. During the entire duration of the rite of changing the vestment, the Dominican Novices of the Dominican Novitiate of the Annunciation pray the Holy Rosary

# DOMINICAN NOVITIATE OF THE ANNUNCIATION (DNA)



**T**ucked in the corner of the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag is a cloister built for the Novices of the Dominican Province of the Philippines. Since the time of its inauguration on March 25, 1990, the Dominican Novitiate of the Annunciation has been home to generations of discerning young men who are initiated into the Dominican way of life for a whole year before embracing Religious Profession. Secluded in this quiet and private part of the compound, these Novices spend their day in a structured schedule or *horarium* where they begin to learn more about the Order of Preachers through study and prayer. The peaceful ambiance of this part of this sacred ground disposes the Novices in a prayerful and contemplative environment necessary for the discernment of their calling into religious life. Here, silence, prayer and meditation are given emphasis as an integral part of their

formation because it allows these future Dominicans to be present in Christ, and Christ to be present in them.

It is also during this time that they perform a ministry in the Minor Basilica. The intentions that the pilgrims write upon visiting the Basilica are read and prayed for by the Novices themselves during their Solitude Day every Wednesdays, after which these intentions are burned into ashes. As the smoke from these burned intentions rise above the ground, so do the prayers that come with them. The personal intentions of the devotees, combined with the prayers of the Novices, create a communal prayer more attractive and pleasing to God.

When they are not in the grounds of the Novitiate, however, these Novices are in the Basilica performing their more active apostolates. Serving as proclaimers of the Word of God and choir, they take part in the Conventual Masses at five-forty in the morning on weekdays and nine o'clock on Sundays. Also, they distribute the Holy Communion among thousands of pilgrims on weekend masses and help sprinkle holy water on vehicles lined up the entire day on Saturdays and more so on Sundays. They take pride in performing these active apostolates so that it becomes an avenue for them to preach in ways that may not necessarily use words but are nonetheless effective.

The Dominican brothers who pass through the Novitiate formation in Manaoag credit *Apo Baket* of Manaoag for walking with them in their Novitiate journey. She becomes a mother who guides her sons as they go through this stage of discernment - of following her Son through the footsteps of St. Dominic. So much so that the strands of their Dominican DNA become a rhythm of praise to the Virgin who calls. Like the pilgrims flocking the Basilica of Our Lady, with prayers in their lips and praises in their hands, a trip toward her altar, whether to distribute communion or to bless the faithful, the novices shall joyfully serve with a habit; in the habit.





# THINGS YOU MIGHT MISS ABOUT OUR PARISH

Aside from the joyful atmosphere and the enthusiasm of the people in the Basilica, there are many underrated things which in fact are not less interesting: the activities in the Our Lady of Rosary Parish. To bring people closer to God, the parish has activities for worship, evangelization and formation, such as praying 2000 Hail Mary, Bible Sharing, recollections, and many other interesting activities. In doing so, the parish hopes to lead the faithful closer to their community. The parish has various programs on social services, namely an almsgiving program, tree-planting, prison visits and other programs which may help the faithful live the Word of God and the teachings of Christ more effectively and joyfully.

The parish also cares for the youth through catechesis every Sunday. As well, they animate these young men and women, the future generation of the Church, to offer their services in the Basilica on weekends and other special occasions as ushers or collectoras. Moreover, the Parish Youth Ministry holds Youth Encounter seminars in different barangays in Manaoag to boost the moral and spiritual life of the youth. Hopefully, these young people would later become our young catechists who would lead the children to pray the rosary and to read the bible.





# COLEGIO DE SAN JUAN DE LETRAN – MANAOAG



**C**olegio de San Juan de Letran-Manaoag, formerly known as “Holy Rosary Academy”, was founded in 1946 by Rev. Fr. Teodulo Cajigal OP, the last Spanish Dominican in Manaoag, Pangasinan. The College has been a home for thousands of students who work towards their brighter future. The academic and spiritual atmosphere of Letran-Manaoag has helped students be formed in their intellectual, social and spiritual life.

Letran-Manaoag is a member of the OneLetran school system that includes Intramuros, Bataan, and Calamba. The collaboration and sharing of resources from this OneLetran System have made their development faster. On the other hand, Letran-Manaoag is fortunate to have UST that continues to help in many ways in developing the educational system of the college. In addition, It is a pride of Letran-Manaoag that the Commission on Higher Education “CHED” has allowed the college to accept grantees of the

TES or Tertiary Education System program offered by the Commission. Through the subsidy program, the students can avail of higher education and at the same time help the college to increase its enrolment. Letran-Manaoag offers various courses that mold students to become well-trained, competitive professionals from Pre-Elementary, High School and College.

As of today, Letran-Manaoag is enriched with a new mode of learning, which renders many services to the students. For instance, it has introduced “Hyflex” learning which helps students and teachers interact online and face-to-face simultaneously.

For more than three decades, the Administration of Letran-Manaoag was managed and supervised by the Dominican Missioneras Sisters.





# HAND IN HAND AMONG THE EMPLOYEES

**T**he Shrine of Our Lady of Manaog Employees Marketing Cooperative or (SOLMEMCO) is an innovation of the Minor Basilica community which has been operating since August 2010. It was first initiated by the Dominican fathers who cared for the needs and welfare of their employees. The goal of the cooperative is to augment the income of the employees of the Minor Basilica.

The members of SOLMEMCO are regular employees and former employees (retired/resigned employees) of the Minor Basilica and the Parish of Our Lady of the Rosary. The members are engaged in the production and marketing of religious articles, such as candles, rosaries, crucifixes and other souvenirs, and all kinds of religious articles that are sold in the religious stores of the Minor Basilica. The cooperative also extends credit services to its members to support them in their unexpected times of need.





# DEVOTEES OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY OF MANAOAG, NEW JERSEY

The *"tawag"* (call) of Apo Baket has resounded thousands of miles across the globe. The devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag in New Jersey has increased to 16 chapters (including North Carolina) and is still expected to spread across the United States. The Devotees of Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag is a non-profit organization affiliated with the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary. It aims to propagate and promote devotion and reverence to Our Lady thus deepening their faith in her Son, Jesus.

The founding members of the devotion select worthy and committed custodians who are commissioned during the monthly masses in honor of OLRM. They bring the image of Our Lady to households in need of healing, for the sick, the needy, those in need of evangelization, or those who miss and want to embrace the Filipino religiosity they left in their motherland.

The devotees participate in various activities of Marian devotion and other Church events, bringing with them the statue of Apo Baket each time. Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaoag has been a mainstay in the annual Marian Festival at the Blue Army Shrine in New Jersey which is attended by devotees of different nationalities. The Blue Army Shrine is the National Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in the US.







We also bring the image of the Blessed Mother to nursing homes and to the homebound. The thirst of people for the love of the Blessed Mother is very evident in the photos. We, as migrants in the US, consider it a valuable mission to propagate the devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary of Manaog here in the mainstream of the United States. By her grace, we are able to propagate faith and love for her Son through the Holy Rosary. We pray that Apo Baket will always cover us with her mantle of love and protection.
